Dear Friends,

As we look back on 2023, I'm excited to share the wonderful progress Living and Learning Enrichment Center has achieved. This year has been filled with growth, expanded services, and stronger community ties.

Our Living and Learning family grew by 25%, reaching 129 dedicated team members. This growth enhanced our vocational program and other essential services. We're thrilled that our clinical team now includes 4 Board-Certified Behavior Analysts, enabling us to provide even better support.

We helped 55 individuals find meaningful employment across 18 different cities, and our community partnerships blossomed to 100 business partners across 20 industries. New satellite hub locations have made our programs more accessible to families across the region.

Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, we were awarded more than \$300,000 in grants, and our annual Hopes and Dreams Gala raised \$245,000 for our programs. Our social enterprise, Mod Market, saw a 20% increase in sales, providing valuable work experience for our members.

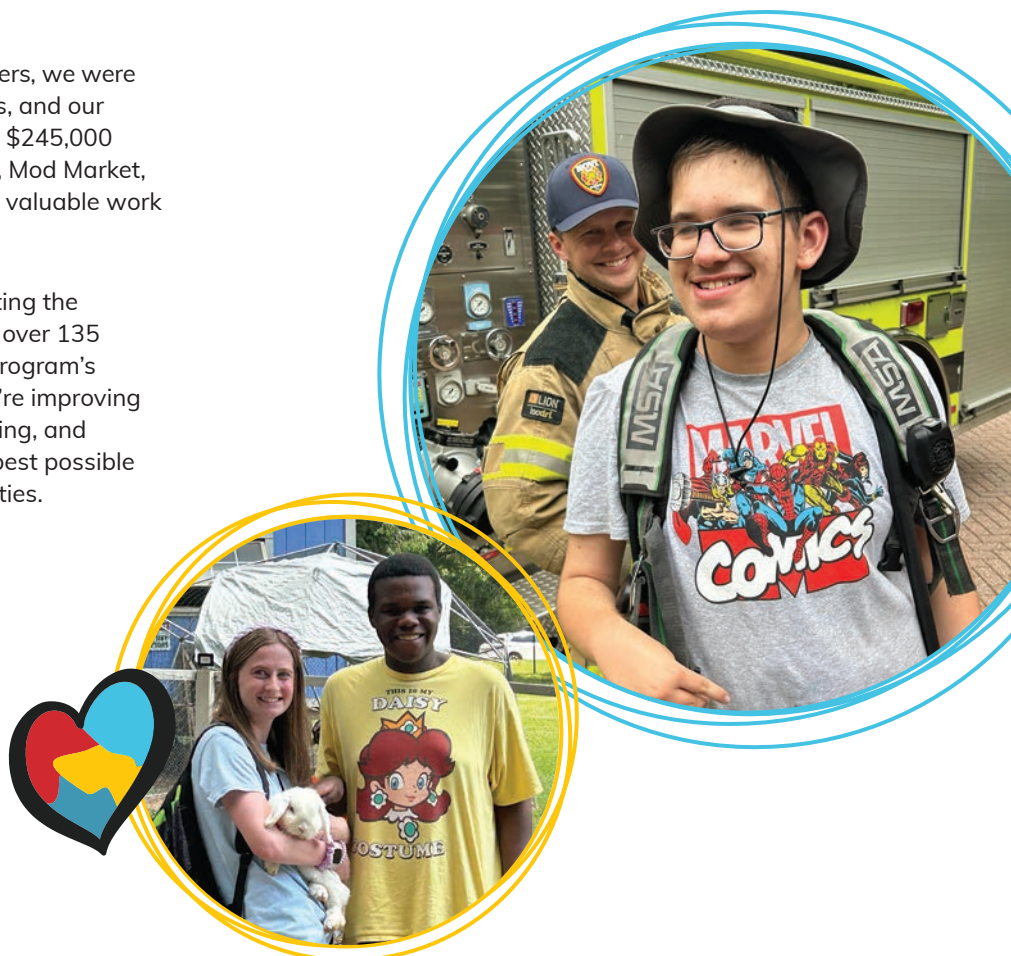

Finding His Place:

Kyle Baker's Journey to Fulfillment at Living and Learning

For Kyle Baker and his mother Heidi, the path to meaningful employment seemed uncertain after Kyle's graduation from the Plymouth/Canton school system and subsequent participation in Madonna University's transition program. As Kyle approached 26, Heidi found herself searching for options that would support her son's unique needs and talents.

Enter Living and Learning Enrichment Center.

On the recommendation of one of Kyle's former teachers, Heidi reached out to Living and Learning. After a year-long wait, Kyle was offered a spot in the Vocational Program—an opportunity that would prove transformative.

"Kyle has 'worked' a lot of places and he always dreaded having to go to work," Heidi shared with Jen Carpen, Living and Learning's Vocational Director. But at Living and Learning, everything changed.

Starting with two days a week, Kyle rotated through various job sites, including Independence Village, Art and Jakes, Ace Hardware, and Aramark. The experience was nothing short of revolutionary for Kyle. Unlike other programs that expected participants to fit a predetermined mold, Living and Learning embraced Kyle's individuality.

"The Living and Learning staff is kind and accommodating and truly cares about the person's individuality," Heidi explains. "I love the structure Living and Learning provides."

For Kyle, the impact is clear and simple: "I have fun and like being part of a team."

Kyle's enthusiasm for the program has only grown. He recently requested to increase his participation to three days a week, adding the Living and Learning Soap Studio to his roster of job sites. He's forging meaningful friendships with co-workers and developing special bonds with his job coaches, even discovering shared interests like Disney and Lorcan Cards.

These connections go beyond mere work relationships. They provide Kyle with a sense of belonging and purpose. His mother notes that Kyle's caring nature shines through in these interactions, as evidenced by his eagerness to share his prized Lorcan Cards with a job coach's husband.

The impact of Living and Learning extends far beyond job skills. As Heidi beautifully articulates, "You're providing hope and acceptance that most of the world is lacking. It's a huge sense of relief to finally find something that he enjoys, that will help ease this transition and enrich his life... every parent's dream."

At Living and Learning Enrichment Center, Kyle Baker isn't just finding a job—he's finding his place in the world, one day at a time.
